# **BENCH RACTING** - by Bill Bench COOL KATZ, COOL MOUNTAINS, AND A HOT TIP.

Last month, Travis Jeffrey and I headed up to Dayton, Ohio for the DADDY KATZ model contest and swap meet. I'd heard a lot about it, but had no idea what a cool place it was. Lots of '50's-'60's vibe with just a small hint of the 21st century. Plenty of stuff to see, buy, and even a tattoo parlor if you feel the need. It was small, but there were 125 models entered, and it was great to see some of the old and familiar faces that I've known for over 22 years. They are always having events going on every week. Log onto WWW.DADDYKATZ.COM for more details. There is supposed to be another contest in March, and this old boy is planning on being there. Now here's something weird. I had two models that have been in progress for years that I was planning on leaving in Gray and Black primer. Even though I saw plenty of primered Rat Rods at Daddy Katz, I got home, dug out a '56 Ford that was painted with Gray primer, cleaned it up a little, and painted it with Testor's ICY BLUE one-coat lacquer. That stuff goes on sooo nice, as you can see in the picture. I don't have a picture, but I painted my Black primered '40 Willys with Testor's GRAPHITE METALLIC one-coat lacguer. Had to go over it a few times, But so far, it looks good. It got Al and Travis' approval. Had the week of Thanksgiving off, so Barb and I headed to Salem, Arkansas to spend Thanksgiving with her family. Where they live is in the Ozark mountain range. Parts of it remind me of the Appalachian Mountains, while other parts are full of gray rock & reddish-brown dirt. While I'm there, I always like to visit Rodger's Hobby Shop in Mammoth Spring. Arkansas. It's a little hard to find, but he has a few unusual things reasonably priced, and he is an unforgettable character. It's also a muffler shop, which seems an odd marriage, but he seems to be making a living doing it. There is also a Radio Shack in town, where they seem to be the only one that stocks 30 gauge insulated wrapping wire, which makes great 1/25th spark plug wiring. I was hoping that they had Red, but all they had was Blue, and White. Remembering an old tip that I saw in Scale Auto over a decade ago, I bought both of them, and stopped by the local Dollar General store, and purchased a set of Bic permanent markers. Unrolling some of the White wire, I used a Red marker to do a little "Coloring" on all sides and VIOLA!! Red wire! As you can see in the photos, there are many possibilities for different colored wiring, so give it a try. See you at the meeting, Bill

#### Dan Fink's Speedwagon

A couple of moths ago, I featured a kit review of four 1932 Fords by Revell/Monogram that were based on the same chassis.



Since then, someone pointed out to me (and I am sorry if I do not remember who you are) that there was a fifth model based on the same chassis. Dan Fink's Speedwagon, premiered after the 3-window coupe, and about the same time as the roadster. This is basically the same as the other four models. In fact the "extra" parts that are found in the other kits come directly from this kit. The 5.0 fuel injected engine is the extra engine in the 5-window coupe, the wheels and tires are the same from the 3-window coupe, the straight hood and side engine covers are the options in the sedan. So why mention this kit at all? The body is a truly unique custom that is not part of the 1932 Ford catalog. A 2-door wagon with wood siding. Now combine that with all the aforementioned custom options (Kit Review October 2010) and you can easily put a flat head engine, wire wheels, and a louvered hood. Or any other combination that you can imagine. Enjoy.


**Choosing a subject:** This is easy enough, build what you like. Many of us build cars, however there is a wide variety of subjects available to build.
